### Presentation Summary

The U.S. antidumping laws prohibit the sale of imported goods at less than fair value and at less than the cost of production. The countervailing duty laws prohibit foreign countries from subsidizing exports. In both cases, the remedy is a penalty duty in the amount of the below cost sale or the subsidy.

Industries that historically have been most affected by unfair import practices include: steel, tires, auto components, valves/gears, textiles/apparel, wire, pipe/tube, appliances and nuts/bolts/fasteners.

Learn how to identify potentially unfair trade practices before they impact your sales and learn how to use applicable trade laws to protect your company and products from predatory trade practices.
