Toxic Release Inventory – The Beginning of the PFAS Era

Found throughout supply chains due to the unique performance characteristics they provide, per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) seem to be everywhere, and now the U.S. EPA wants to know more about where they are used and how they may be released into the environment by U.S. manufacturing facilities.

U.S. EPA's first step is implementing a **new PFAS reporting requirement** under the U.S. Toxic Release Inventory (TRI) Reporting Program that mandates disclosure of annual chemical releases of nearly 200 PFAS substances **on or before July 1, 2021** based on facilities' 2020 operations.

Companies need to be prepared to make these submissions.

Because the PFAS release data collected under the TRI Program will subsequently be made available to the public and are likely to be heavily scrutinized, companies need to be prepared for any political and public relations implications and anticipate the need for action following the initial reporting period.
