

How to Establish and Roll Out an Emergency Action Plan

An **emergency action plan** (EAP), (not to be confused with an employee assistance program!) is a written document required by OSHA standard 29 CFR 1910.38(a) for employers with 11 or more employees.

The purpose of an EAP is to facilitate and organize employer and employee actions during workplace emergencies.

During the webinar we'll talk about the minimum plan requirements, offer suggestions for implementation, and recommend important post-emergency activities such as training and critiques.

We'll also cover the requirements of a fire prevention plan. You may want to create one plan that encompasses fire prevention as well as emergency actions.

An EAP will define these procedures:

- Reporting an emergency
- Evacuation, including exit route assignments
- Employees who remain to operate critical plant operations
- Accounting for all employees
- Performing rescue or medical duties
- Alarm systems
