Year after year OSHA violations involving powered industrial trucks (PITs) are among the top 10 most commonly cited standards. In 2019, PIT violations were the seventh most frequently cited among all violations.

Additionally, insurance carriers are beginning to emphasize fleet safety programs due to increased losses resulting from on-the-job accidents, which are not limited to over-the-road haulers but include sales teams and office staff.

And, according to the National Safety Council, "Off-the-job crashes account for 80% of employer crash-related health benefit costs, and half of crash-related injuries cause employees to miss work."
