Columbia Increases its Capital Expenditure Program Charges (Case No. 22-0621-GA-RDR)

Summary: To recoup from customers the costs associated with its capital expenditure program (CEP), Columbia increased its CEP Rider charges for Small Generation Service (SGS), General Service (GS), and Large General Service (LGS). The SGS charge increased to \$7.33 per month from \$5.91 per month, the GS charge increased to \$54.01 per month from \$41.45 per month, and the LGS charge increased to \$1,273.85 per month from \$1,005.05 per month.

PUCO Grants U.S. Attorney's Request to Stay All HB 6 Discovery Proceedings for Six Months (Case Nos. 17-0974-EL-UNC et al.)

Summary: As expected, the PUCO granted the U.S. Attorney's request to stay the four HB 6 proceedings for six months. Since both the criminal investigation and PUCO cases involve many of the same FirstEnergy persons, the PUCO determined that there was substantial overlap between discovery in the HB 6 proceedings and the pending criminal investigation and feared that the overlap created a danger of interfering with the investigation and potential self-incrimination.
